ORDER

PENAL NOTICE

IF YOU THE WITHIN NAMED DEFENDANTS DISOBEY THIS ORDER YOU
MAYBE HELD TO BE IN CONTEMPT OF COURT AND MAY BE IMPRISONED OR
FINED OR YOU MAY BE FOUND TO BE GUILTY OF A CRIMINAL
OFFENCE FOR WHICH YOU MAY BE IMPRISONED OR FINED OR BOTH.

Definitions

This Order shall be construed in accordance with the following:

1. The employees of the First Claimants and the Protected Persons (as herein defined) having the same interests in the claim, all such shall be represented by the Second Claimant, Brian Cass, pursuant to CPR 19.6.
2. All persons forming the unincorporated association, Stop Huntingdon Animal Cruelty ("SHAC") having the same interests in responding to the claim herein, all such shall be represented by Max Gastone, pursuant to CPR 19.6.
3. In this Order:

- a. 'Harass' has the same meaning as in the Protection from Harassment Act 1997.
- b. References to 'he', 'him' or 'his' shall be taken to include 'she', 'her' or 'hers' where appropriate;
- c. 'Exclusion zone' shall mean any area as identified in which protesting activities are prohibited or curtailed by this Order;
- d. 'Protestor' or 'Protestors' shall mean:
 - (1) the Defendants whether by themselves, their servants or agents; and
 - (2) any other person, whether by himself his servants or agents, who is acting in concert with the Defendants with a view to exposing, deterring, obstructing or preventing the conduct of experimentation on live animals by the First Claimants..
- e. 'Protected Persons' shall mean:
 - (1) the Second Claimant;
 - (2) the employees of the First Claimants;
 - (3) the families, servants or agents of such employees; and
 - (4) any person (other than a Protestor) seeking to visit the premises of the First Claimants, alternatively the premises of any of the foregoing Protected Persons.

THE ORDER

Upon hearing at the trial of this action Leading Counsel for the Claimants and Max Gastone in person.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Protestors be restrained from pursuing any course of conduct such as amounts to harassment of the Protected Persons within the meaning of the Protection from Harassment Act 1997.
2. In particular the Protestors be restrained from doing, causing, permitting, encouraging or assisting any of the following:
 - a. Assaulting, harassing molesting, threatening or otherwise interfering with any Protected Person;
 - b. Intentionally photographing any Protected Person or his vehicle;
 - c. Making any abusive or threatening communication whether orally, by telephone, in writing, by facsimile, or by e-mail to any Protected Person;
 - d. Knowingly picketing, demonstrating or loitering within 50 yards of any residence of any Protected Person;
 - e. Publishing by any means whatsoever names, addresses, telephone numbers, fax numbers, e-mail addresses, car or other vehicle registration numbers or any other

material serving to identify a Protected Person or to publish his personal details.

PROVIDED THAT

As and when a Protected Person is identified as such for the purposes of a newspaper article or a radio or television programme there shall be no restraint upon repetition of that which is so featured in the media nor upon the terms of any media response;

- f. Inciting, compelling or otherwise seeking to persuade any Protected Person against his will from doing something he is entitled or required to do.

3. Alconbury

- a. Save as specifically provided for hereinafter: the Protestors be restrained from coming into or remaining in the Exclusion Zone identified on the attached Plan A for the purposes of, or for conducting any demonstration or protest, such Zone comprising:
- (1) the First Claimants' Woolley Road premises (coloured red);
 - (2) the immediately adjoining land (coloured yellow); and
 - (3) the highway, its verges and lay-bys (coloured blue)
- b. Provided that a demonstration may be conducted once every 7 days at the designated area identified on Plan A on terms:
- (1) the number of Protestors present shall not exceed 30 persons;
 - (2) the maximum duration shall not exceed 6 hours;
 - (3) the Protestors may not drive vehicles over Woolley Road save as is hereinafter specified and save to take participants in the demonstration to and from the designated area, with all such vehicular use of Woolley Road being subject to reasonable direction by attending Police Officers;
 - (4) the Protestors may not park any vehicle within half a mile of the designated area save that one car may be driven to and from the immediate vicinity of the designated area so as to be parked there for the duration of the demonstration at a point identified by attending Police Officers;
 - (5) the Protestors be restrained for the duration of the demonstration from using any megaphone, klaxon, siren, whistle, drum, noise amplification device or any other instrument or other appliance used or capable of being used to generate noise; save that one megaphone may be used for verbal amplification only and at a noise level not exceeding 7 in the course of the demonstration between 12.0 p.m. and 1.0 p.m., with such use subject to reasonable direction by attending Police Officers; and
 - (6) the protestors shall have given 24 hours prior notice of their intention so to demonstrate and of the registration number of any car that is to be parked in the immediate vicinity of the designated area, respectively by notification to Huntingdon Police Station (telephone number 01480 456111)
- c. Provided further that not more than once every three months a lawful, peaceful procession or assembly on the public highway may enter the Exclusion Zone on a Saturday, or a Sunday or a Bank Holiday on terms:
- (1) there being continuing compliance with Sections 11, 12 and 14 Public Order

Act 1986.

- (2) there be compliance with all reasonable directions as given by the Police as to conduct, route and timing;
- (3) there be verbal amplification only by means of one or more megaphones again as reasonably directed by the Police;
- (4) there be notice of such procession or assembly given at least 14 days in advance to Huntingdon Police Station (telephone number 01480 456111)

4. **Occold**

- a. Save as specifically provided for hereinafter the Protestors be restrained from coming into or remaining on the Exclusion Zone identified on the attached Plan B for the purposes of, or for conducting any demonstration or protest, such Zone comprising:
 - (1) the First Claimants' premises (coloured red);
 - (2) the immediately adjoining land (coloured yellow); and
 - (3) the highway, its verges and lay bys (coloured blue).

- b. Provided that a demonstration may be conducted once every 7 days at the designated area identified on Plan B on terms:
 - (1) the number of protestors present shall not exceed 25 persons;
 - (2) the maximum duration shall not exceed 6 hours;
 - (3) the Protestors may not drive vehicles over the access road, save as is hereinafter specified and save to take participants in the demonstration to and from the designated area, with all such vehicular use of the access road being subject to reasonable direction by attending Police Officers;
 - (4) the Protestors may not park any vehicle within half a mile of the designated area save that one car may be driven to and from the designated area so as to be parked thereat for the duration of the demonstration;
 - (5) the Protestors be restrained for the duration of the demonstration from using any megaphone, klaxon, siren, whistle, drum, noise amplification device or any instrument or other alliance used or capable of being used to generate noise; and
 - (6) the Protestors shall have given 24 hours prior notice of their intention so to demonstrate and of the registration number of any car that is to be parked in the designated area respectively by notification to Eye Police Station (telephone number 01379 870478).

- c. Provided further that not more than once every three months a lawful, peaceful procession or assembly on the public highway may enter the Exclusion Zone on a Saturday, or a Sunday or a Bank Holiday on terms:
 - (1) there being continuing compliance with Sections 11, 12 and 14 Public Order Act 1986.
 - (2) there be compliance with all reasonable directions as given by the Police as to conduct, route and timing;
 - (3) there be verbal amplification only by means of one or megaphones again as reasonably directed by the Police;
 - (4) there be notice of such procession or assembly given at least 14 days in advance

to Eye Police Station (telephone number 01379 870478).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT

5. This Order is binding on all Defendants and Protestors pursuant to CPR 19.6(4)(a).
6. There be service of this Order upon the Defendants by personal service upon Max Gastone.
7. There be further substituted service upon Defendants and Protestors by exhibiting the same at the respective exclusion zones and by posting upon the Defendants' website www.shac.net.
8. There be an extension of time within which either party may apply to the Court for permission to appeal to 15th March 2008.
9. Costs be reserved to the Hon Mr. Justice Holland for hearing on the 3rd April 2007.

VARIATION OR DISCHARGE OF THIS ORDER

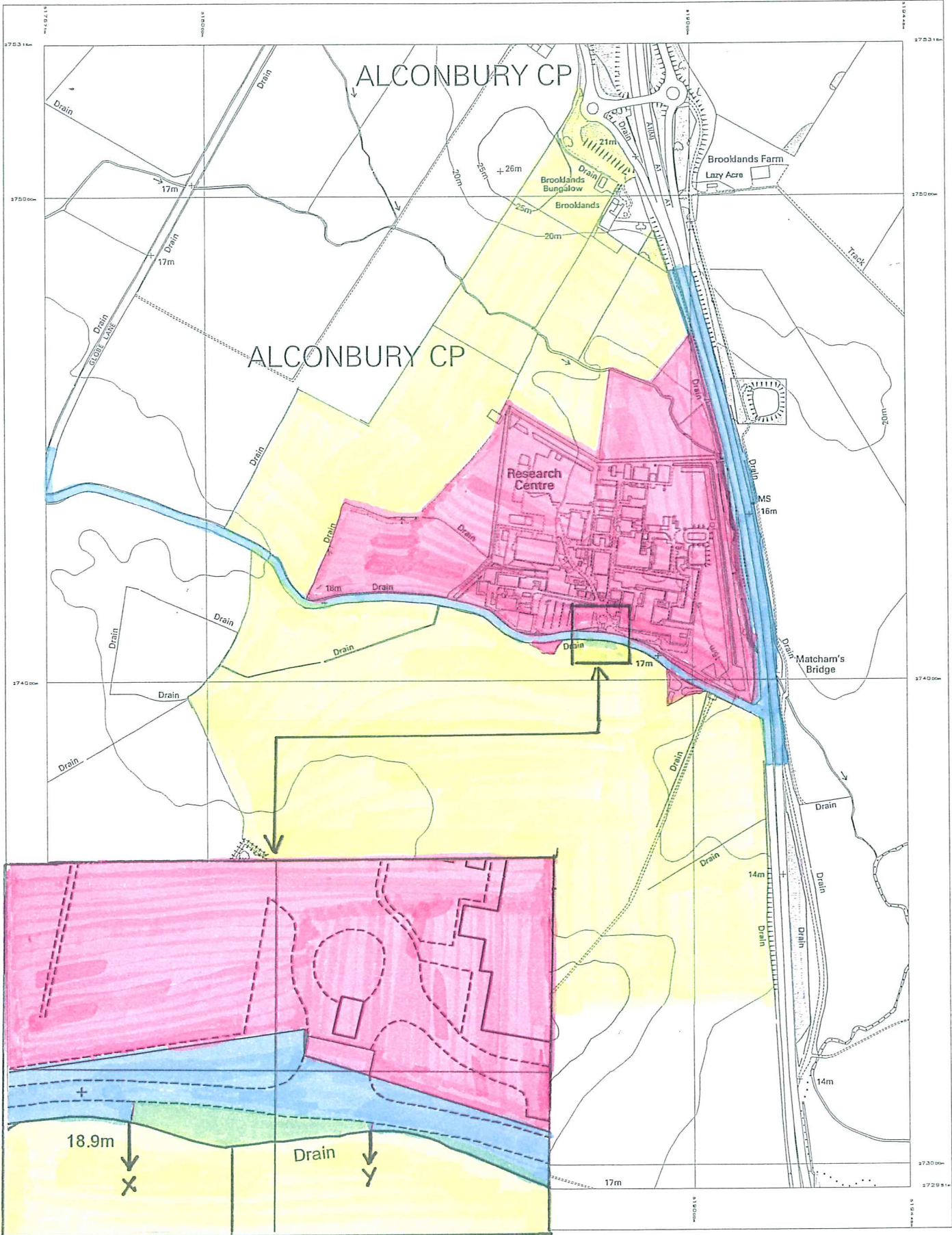
10. The Parties (or anyone notified of this Order) do have liberty to apply and may apply to the Court at any time to vary or discharge this Order (or so much of it as affects that person) but anyone wishing to do so must give 7 days prior notice to the claimants solicitors, Messers Lawson Cruttenden & Co 10-11 Gray's Inn Square, London WC1R 5JD – telephone number 0207 405 0833. INTERPRETATION OF THIS ORDER

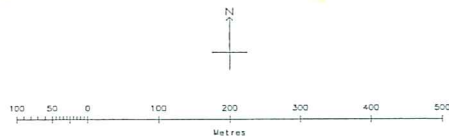
11. In this Order, where there is more than one Defendant or Protestor, (unless otherwise stated) references to “the Defendant” or a “Protestor” means both or all of them.
12. A requirement to serve on “one Defendant” or “one Protestor” means on each of them. However, the Order is effective against any Defendant or Protestor on whom it is served.
13. An Order requiring “the Defendant” or a “Protestor” to do or not to do anything applies to all Defendants and Protestors.

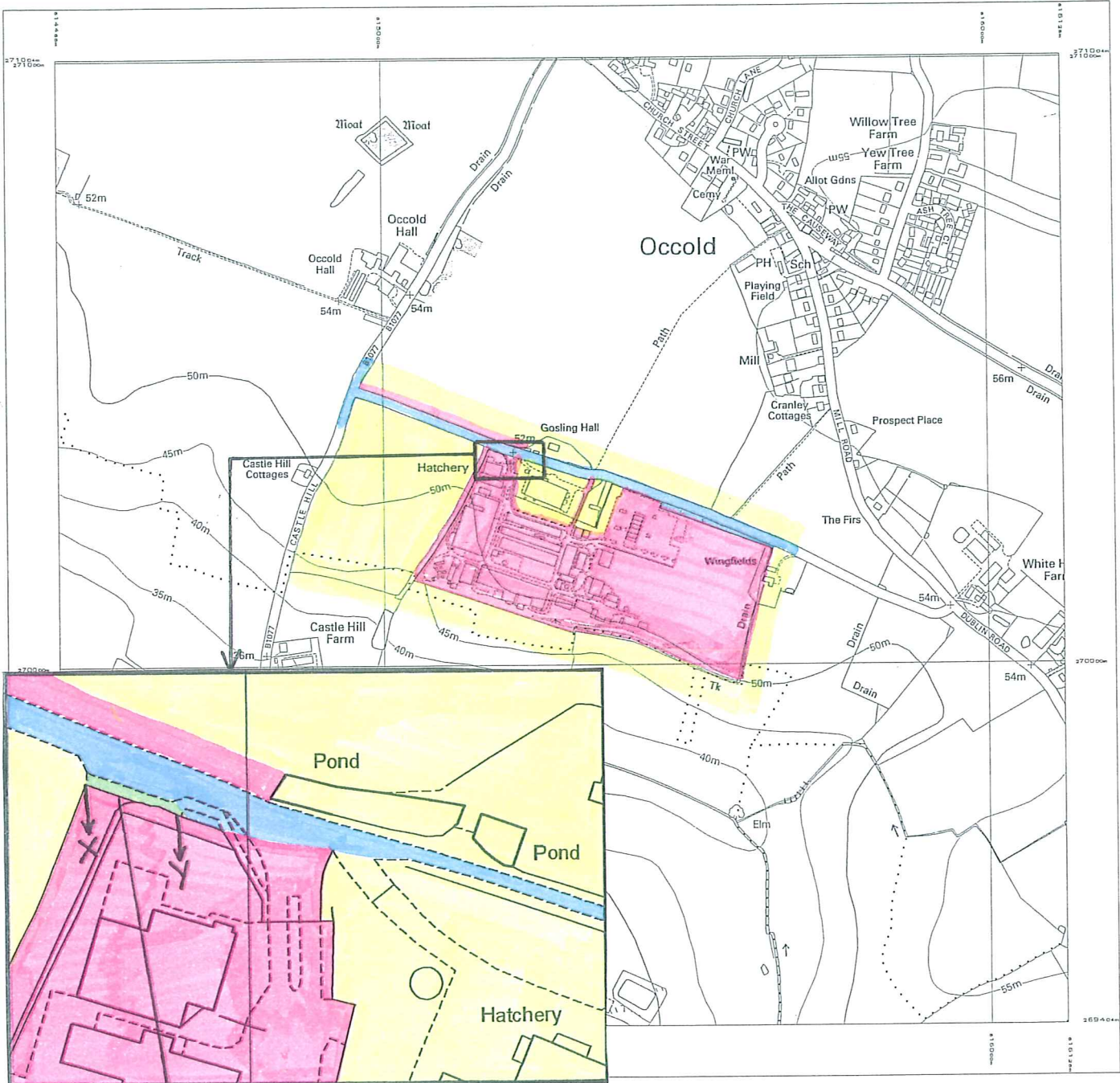
